

## CRE Mission Statement

The Center for Regulatory Effectiveness (CRE),

- serves as an advocate for, and a historian of, the interests and activities of the Office of Information and Regulatory Affairs in the White House Office of Management and Budget.
- is a nationally acclaimed regulatory watchdog founded and managed by former regulatory officials of the regulatory review office (OIRA) of the White House Office of Management and Budget. To this end CRE ensures that regulators comply with the “good government” laws which “regulate the regulators”.
- files petitions pursuant to the Data Quality Act to ensure that data disseminated by federal agencies is objective, unbiased and reproducible. As a result of CRE activities federal agencies routinely correct inaccurate information contained in their regulations, guidance and websites. CRE acts in its own name, not that of its sponsors.
- has personnel who have been appointed to the Administrative Conference of the United States, the federal agency in charge of overseeing the administrative process. The government members of the organization are the top legal officials of the United States government.
- manages a number of websites dedicated to increasing the transparency of the regulatory process, including TheOMB.US, a website focused on OMB’s role in centralized regulatory review. CRE also reports on the activities of the White House Office of Management and Budget.
