**Re: Notice of *Ex Parte* Presentation
MB Dkt Nos. 06-121 and 02-227

Dear Ms. Dortch,

This letter is to advise you, in accordance with Section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules, that on September 25, 2007, Marvin Ammori, Ben Scott, and Derek Turner of Free Press and Mark Cooper of Consumer Federation of America met with Chairman Kevin Martin and Krista Witanowski at the offices of the Federal Communications Commission.

We discussed the Motion for Extension and the Complaint Under the Data Quality Act filed in this proceeding by Free Press, Consumer Federation of America, and Consumers Union on Sept. 11, 2007. We reiterated that the public must be able to analyze the Commission's ten recently released ownership studies and that the Commission would benefit from a more complete and balanced record in this proceeding.

We also reiterated that the Commission must ensure transparency for these studies, particularly by ensuring reproducibility. To ensure reproducibility, the Commission must make available the data underlying these studies as well as sufficient time to analyze these data. We explained that the underlying data was only very recently made available, weeks into the comment period. We also explained why an extension of 90 days was necessary, describing some of the analyses that we plan to undertake or that we are in the process of undertaking.

We also discussed the manner of making available to the public a certain set of data (consisting of hundred of hours of video clips) that underlie Study 6 by Jeffrey Milyo. Although the Media Bureau had previously offered access limited to the Commission's offices, we requested access for locations away from the Commission's offices, subject to appropriate nondisclosure agreements. Although we cannot analyze these clips during 90 additional days, we informed the Chairman that we planned on filing regarding all other analyses within 90 days and then to file the results of analyzing the video clips as an *ex parte* following the comment period.
