**Abstract:** This document proposes to expand beneficiary coverage for certain prostheses; e.g., noses, ears, and fingers, used in the medically necessary treatment of certain medical conditions and removes from exclusions, enuretic devices, as provided under the CHAMPVA Program. Additionally, this proposed rule would provide clarification of the delegation of authority related to timely claim filing and the claim appeals/review process. Since Public Law 107-135 redesignates CHAMPVA authority in 38 U.S.C. 1713 to 38 U.S.C. 1781, this document would also revise the authority citations for the CHAMPVA regulations.

Additionally, this proposed rule would establish eligibility criteria for a dual eligible beneficiary. A spouse who is a veteran and entitled to receive medical care through the VA health care system based on his or her own veteran status and is married to another veteran that meets the criteria contained in section 17.271(a)(1)(2) and (3) as a CHAMPVA sponsor is considered a dual eligible beneficiary. This spouse/veteran is entitled to health care under both the CHAMPVA program and the VA health care system. The spouse/veteran may choose either health care system for each new episode of care.

The current rating schedule provides an evaluation level of 10 percent under Diagnostic Code 7803 for multiple superficial unstable scars and an evaluation level of 10 percent under Diagnostic Code 7804 for multiple superficial painful scars. The current rating schedule provides no guidance on whether each painful or each unstable scar no matter how small or close together should be separately evaluated. The current rating schedule is silent as to whether one scar can be rated more than once under diagnostic codes 7802, 7803, and/or 7804. This regulatory amendment replaces the concept of "widely separated areas" by defining and using the concept of

"separate anatomical location." This regulatory amendment instructs adjudicators in the following: How to evaluate scars which traverse separate anatomical locations; how to evaluate multiple scars in a separate anatomical locations; how to evaluate scars which satisfy evaluation criteria for two or more of the following diagnostic codes: 7802, 7803, and 7804; and how to evaluate multiple scars of the head, face, and neck where there is also disfigurement in this area. Each diagnostic code has been retitled; within Diagnostic Code 7800, we have included all aspects of scars and/or disfigurement of the head, face, and neck; therefore, the titles to the remaining scar codes now include the words "Scars, other than those of the head, face, and neck region."

Section 1032 of Public Law 109-13 expanded the Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance (SGLI) program to provide for the payment of traumatic injury (TSGLI) benefits to insured members who suffer a loss as a result of traumatic injury. The law stipulates however that a schedule of injuries and benefits must be issued prior to the statutory effective date for the program to begin paying TSGLI benefits. This action amends 38 CFR by adding a new section, section 9.20, "Traumatic Injury Protection.

**Abstract:** The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is issuing this final rule to implement the provisions of section 1032 of the "Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act for Defense, the Global War on Terror, and Tsunami Relief, 2005" (Pub. L. 109-13). Section 1032 of Public Law 109-13 establishes an automatic traumatic injury protection rider provision to Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance (SGLI), effective December 1, 2005, providing automatic insurance for any SGLI insured who sustains a serious traumatic injury as prescribed by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs in collaboration with he Secretary of Defense that results in certain losses prescribed by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs in collaboration with Secretary of Defense. This rule specifies the losses for which the traumatic injury benefit (TSGLI) will be paid and the amount of the TSGLI benefit payable for each loss. Section 1032(c)(1)also provides for the payment of TSGLI benefits to service members who experienced a traumatic injury between October 7, 2001, and the effective date of section 1032 of Public Law 109-13; i.e., December 1, 2005, if the loss was a direct result of injuries incurred in Operation Enduring Freedom or Operation Iraqi Freedom.
