#### Spring 2007 Semiannual Agenda of Regulations

**AGENCY:** Office of the Secretary,

Commerce.

**ACTION:** Semiannual regulatory agenda.

**SUMMARY:** In compliance with Executive Order 12866 entitled "Regulatory Planning and Review" and the Regulatory Flexibility Act, as amended, the Department of Commerce (Department), in the spring and fall of each year, publishes in the Federal Register an agenda of regulations under development or review over the next 12 months. Rulemaking actions are grouped according to prerulemaking, proposed rules, final rules, long-term actions, and rulemaking actions completed since the fall 2006 agenda. The purpose of the agenda is to provide information to the public on regulations currently under review, being proposed, or issued by the Department. The agenda is intended to facilitate comments and views by interested members of the public.

The Department's spring 2007 regulatory agenda includes regulatory activities that are expected to be conducted during the period April 1, 2007 through March 31, 2008.

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: Executive** Order 12866 requires agencies to publish an agenda of those regulations that are under consideration pursuant to this order. By memorandum of February 1, 2007, the Office of Management and Budget issued guidelines and procedures for the preparation and publication of the spring 2007 Unified Agenda of Federal Regulatory and Deregulatory Actions. The Regulatory Flexibility Act, 5 U.S.C. 601 et seq., requires agencies to publish, in the spring and fall of each year, a regulatory flexibility agenda which contains a brief description of the subject area of any rule which is likely to have a significant economic impact on a substantial number of small entities. The agenda also identifies those entries that have been selected for periodic review under section 610 of the Regulatory Flexibility

Within the Department, the Office of the Secretary and various operating units may issue regulations. Operating units, such as the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), the Bureau of Industry and Security, and the Patent and Trademark Office issue the greatest share of the Department's regulations.

A large number of regulatory actions reported in the agenda deal with fishery management programs of NOAA's National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS). To avoid repetition of programs and definitions, as well as to provide some understanding of the

technical and institutional elements of the NMFS programs, a section on "Explanation of Information Contained in NMFS Regulatory Entries" is provided below.

### **Explanation of Information Contained** in NMFS Regulatory Entries

The Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act (16 U.S.C. 1801 et seq.) (Act) governs the management of fisheries within the Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ). The EEZ refers to those waters from the outer edge of the State boundaries, generally 3 nautical miles, to a distance of 200 nautical miles. Fishery Management Plans (FMPs) are to be prepared for fisheries, which require conservation and management measures. Regulations implementing these FMPs regulate domestic fishing and foreign fishing where permitted. Foreign fishing can be conducted in a fishery in which there is no FMP only if a preliminary fishery management plan has been issued to govern that foreign fishing. Under the Act, eight Regional Fishery Management Councils (Councils) prepare FMPs or amendments to FMPs for fisheries within their respective areas. In the development of such plans or amendments and their implementing regulations, the Councils are required by law to conduct public hearings on the draft plans and to consider the use of alternative means of regulating.

The Council process for developing FMPs and amendments makes it difficult for NMFS to determine the significance and timing of some regulatory actions under consideration by the Councils at the time the semiannual regulatory agenda is published.

The model Additional Protocol requires enhanced information collection and access to provide IAEA inspectors with greater ability to detect clandestine nuclear activities in non-nuclear weapons states (NNWS), and covers almost all of a state's nuclear fuel cycle. The United States, as a nuclear weapons state (NWS) party to the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT), is not obligated to accept IAEA safeguards on its nuclear activities. However, the United States voluntarily signed the U.S. Additional Protocol on June 12, 1998. In this U.S. Additional Protocol, the United States accepts all of the measures of the Model Protocol, except where their application would result in access by the IAEA to activities with direct national security significance to the United States or to locations or information associated with such activities. By submitting itself to the same safeguards on all of its civil nuclear activities that NNWS are subject to (except those of national

security significance), the United States intends to demonstrate that adherence to the model Additional Protocol does not place other countries at a commercial disadvantage.

Declarations submitted under the U.S. Additional Protocol would provide the IAEA with information about additional aspects of the U.S. nuclear fuel cycle, including mining and milling of nuclear materials, nuclear-related equipment manufacturing, nuclearrelated imports and exports, research and development not involving nuclear material, and other nuclear material activities not currently subject to the U.S. Safeguards Agreement. There are no routine inspections under the U.S. Additional Protocol, but IAEA inspectors may be provided access (referred to as "complementary access") to the U.S. nuclear fuel cycle to assure the absence of undeclared nuclear material and activities or where there is a question or an inconsistency about the completeness or correctness of the U.S. declaration, which could relate to declared or undeclared industrial locations. Access to most industrial locations is predicated upon an IAEA request for clarification of a declaration. As with the U.S.-IAEA Safeguards Agreement, the IAEA would not be required to seek access to any U.S. locations. In carrying out the responsibilities delegated to it for implementation of the U.S. Additional Protocol, the Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) will apply a philosophy of ensuring compliance while minimizing intrusion and the burden on commercial activities and emphasizing the protection of confidential business, national security, and other critical information to the maximum extent possible.

**Abstract:** This rule would amend the Chemical Weapons Convention

Regulations (CWCR) to expedite the collection of information concerning the inspection status of plant sites that produce unscheduled discrete organic chemicals (UDOCs) subject to the declaration requirements of the CWCR. The CWCR include requirements to report certain activities, involving scheduled chemicals and unscheduled discrete organic chemicals (UDOCs), and to provide access for on-site verification by international inspectors of certain facilities and locations in the United States. Specifically, this rule would amend the CWCR by revising the annual declaration requirements for UDOCs to permit a "declared" plant site currently subject to inspection, which anticipates that its production of UDOCs during the current calendar year will be below the inspection threshold level indicated in the CWCR, to submit a "Change in Inspection Status Form" to BIS by December 15th of the current calendar year. The information provided to BIS by this new form would ensure that the plant site would not be subject to inspection during the first 90 days of the next calendar year, which is the period when the United States compiles its annual declaration on past activities for submission to the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW). Any such plant site containing at least one plant that anticipates producing an individual PSF chemical (i.e., a UDOC containing the elements phosphorus, sulfur, or fluorine), in quantities that exceed the declaration threshold for such chemicals, will have the option of submitting its "Annual Declaration on Past Activities," in lieu of a "Change in Inspection Status Form," by December 15th of the current calendar year; otherwise, the CWCR require that the "Annual Declaration on Past Activities" be submitted by February 28th of the following year. This rule would create an expedited mechanism for determining which UDOC plant sites would be subject to inspection, thereby allowing the United States to notify the OPCW concerning the inspection status of UDOC plant sites prior to the submission of the U.S. declaration to the OPCW and enabling the OPCW to schedule inspections of UDOC facilities in the United States on a year-round basis.

In the final rule announcing the listing, NMFS identified vessel effects, including direct interference and sound, as a potential contributing factor in the recent decline of this population. Both the Marine Mammal Protection Act (MMPA) and the ESA prohibit take, including harassment, of killer whales, but these statutes do not prohibit specified acts. NMFS is now

considering regulations that would prohibit certain acts, under our general authorities under the ESA and MMPA and their implementing regulations. This regulatory change would not increase or decrease the number of weakfish actually caught, but could reduce by up to 150 pounds the amount of bycatch that could be landed.

**Abstract:** The purpose of Amendment 15 is to provide limited opportunity for harvest when fisheries would otherwise be closed to mitigate severe economic consequences to local communities and States that would otherwise occur. The provisions of this amendment are designed to be implemented during times when the conservation objective for the Klamath River fall Chinook stock precludes fishery access to comingled Chinook salmon stocks. While this amendment seeks to provide additional management flexibility in times of low Klamath River fall Chinook abundance, the overriding purpose of the Fishery Management

Plan remains to preserve the long-term productive capacity of the stock and thereby ensure it continues to contribute meaningfully to ocean and river fisheries in the future. This amendment is not designed to provide for a sizeable fishery, nor is it designed to allow fishing levels that would deplete the stock.

Specifically, Amendment 15 would allow the Council to implement de minimis fisheries, which would: permit an ocean impact rate cap of 10 percent on age-4 Klamath River fall Chinook, if the projected natural spawning escapement associated with a 10 percent age-4 ocean impact rate, including river recreational and tribal impacts, is between 22,000 and 35,000. During the preseason planning process, the Council could further reduce the cap by considering the following issues: (a) Critically low natural spawner abundance, including the risk of Klamath Basin substocks dropping below crucial genetic thresholds; (b) a series of low spawner abundance in recent years; (c) the status of comingled stocks; (d) El Nino or other adverse environmental conditions; (e) Endangered Species Act considerations; and (f) other considerations as appropriate.

If the projected natural escapement associated with a 10 percent ocean impact rate is less than 22,000, the Council shall reduce the allowable age-4 ocean impact rate to reflect the status of the stock. Although this language does not require stopping fishing below 22,000 natural spawners, the regions believe it will be difficult to justify fishing below this level.

It is worth noting that de minimis fishing levels could have been implemented only twice in the last 23 years. (Run size projections have been greater than 35,000 in all other years.) Amendment 15 is, therefore, designed to mitigate the consequences of complete fishery closures likely to occur only occasionally under the current FMP. For perspective, the ocean impact rate on KRFC approved in 2006 was 11.5 percent. De minimis levels allowed for under Amendment 15 would, therefore, in all cases, be more conservative than those allowed in 2006.

species, we conclude that the Puget Sound steelhead DPS is likely to become an endangered species within the foreseeable future throughout all or a significant portion of its range. This action would list the Puget Sound steelhead DPS as a threatened species under the ESA.
